

#### **PMI Australian National Awards 2012**

The PMI Australian Chapters 10<sup>th</sup> National Awards ceremony was held on the Gold Coast on 12 July at a gala dinner following the highly successful Queensland Chapter's conference.

Now with three categories, the prestigious awards, in their  $10^{th}$  year, have matured significantly since Lynda Bourne became PMI Australia Project Manager of the Year in 2003.

### **Australian Project of the Year**

AMP from Sydney won the Australian Project of the Year with their "PAS Integration and Single Client View" project.

Despina Makris, Project Manager, said she was 'absolutely delighted'. Despina brought several of her team to the ceremony and crowded the stage for the announcement.

The PAS Integration and Single Client View project was a massive challenge. The organisation was merging, the team was trialling new methodologies across multiple geographic and country locations leading to very high risk.

The project integrated over a million customers into a single integrated platform and provided product administration information to downstream systems.

Prizes, sponsored by QVC Solutions and ITCOM, valued at \$6,000 were awarded to AMP including entry to the North American PMI Congress.

Communications giant, Telstra was runner up with an extremely complex rollout of telecommunications infrastructure across outback Australia and the islands north of mainland Australia.



## Young Australian Project Manager of the Year

Chintan Shah PMP, also from Sydney, won the Young Australian Project Manager of the Year. Chintan's efforts to identify and manage a vendor relationship were key to his success.

Chintan identified the vendor related issues and sought to get senior stakeholders to agree that he should engage the vendor and resolve the issues.

Chintan was influential and decisive in the resolution of the issues and brought about success for his transformation project when only failure seemed likely. Chintan is a volunteer for the Sydney Chapter. A prize of Professional Development to the value of \$3,000 was sponsored by DDLS.
